

Kuratau School (1785)

ENROLMENT SCHEME

Effective from 29/04/2019

The guidelines for development and operating of enrolment schemes are issued under section 11G (3) of the Education Act 1989 for the purpose of describing the basis on which the Secretary's powers in relation to enrolment schemes will be exercised.

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below (and shown on the attached map) shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Starting at northern boundary of 74 Prince of Wales Drive north along the edge of Lake Taupo to the mouth of the Waihaha River (all addresses on Prince of Wales Drive are excluded from the zone).

From the mouth of the Waihaha River, follow the south bank of the river, to the Tieke Waterfall, then proceed west to the Waihaha Bridge on Western Bay Road (SH 32).

Cross over Western Bay Road (SH 32), and follow the Waihaha Hut Track to the eastern side of the Pureora Forest Park.

Travel south along the boundary of the Pureora Forest Park to the western boundary of 2925 State Highway 41.

From this point, travel south east to the Kuratau River. Travel south along the east bank of the Kuratau River to the junction of the Kuratau River with the Horomango Stream.

From this junction, head north and east, around Kuharua (mountain) to the start point at the edge of Lake Taupo.

Special Programmes

This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a Special Programme approved by the Secretary.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the Board of Trustees will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The Board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will be specific a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

- **First priority** This priority is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programmed approved by the Secretary for Education.
- **Second priority** must be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

- **Third priority** must be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
- **Fourth priority** must be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
- **Fifth priority** must be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
- **Sixth priority** must be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, or fifth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions by the Secretary. Under Section 11G (1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
